San Diego County Outreach Update

Mini Resource Fair and Beneficiary Presentation at Silvercrest Senior Apartments

Last Thursday, April 8, more than 30 residents of **Silvercrest Senior Apartments**learned about the CCI and available resources at a fair hosted with help from the **Latino Network Connection**. Silvercrest is a Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) facility with 125 affordable units for seniors in downtown

San Diego. Since about 50 percent of the participants spoke Russian, Silvercrest management also arranged for an interpreter who was familiar with the CCI. Residents learned about how Cal MediConnect can provide care coordination and other benefits, how to exercise their choices and whom to contact with questions. Representatives from PACE and HICAP also passed out informational materials and helped answer questions during the Q&A session that followed.

Jewish Family Services

On April 11, **Jewish Family Services** sponsored presentations at **Congregation Beth Jacob** for two groups of 15 seniors with follow-up Q&A sessions, accompanied by Russian interpreter services.

Train the Trainer Presentations

Many local community organizations have signed up for Train the Trainer presentations to educate staff members who regularly work with beneficiaries

eligible for Cal MediConnect. These trainings will help ensure that beneficiaries can turn to trusted sources of information with their questions about the CCI. On April 11, for instance, the San Diego region's **IHSS Advisory Committee** received a training on the CCI.

On Wednesday April 9, 12 staff members from the **Union of Pan Asian Community (UPAC)** took part in an informative training about the CCI. UPAC provides linguistically appropriate counseling and outpatient mental health services primarily for people of Asian, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander descent. Given the diverse population this organization serves, it was crucial that staff members left the training feeling confident about their abilities to address clients' needs and explain changes in health care coverage. There are 13 UPAC locations throughout the greater San Diego area.



Los Angeles County Provider Outreach

Last week, provider outreach and education was the main focus in Los Angeles County. Events ranged from small group discussions with medical directors to county specific webinars open to the public.

4/8 - More than 30 frontline staff at Regal Medical Group, an IPA serving primarily Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino counties, participated in an overview training of the CCI. They also discussed additional resources they would use as an organization to strengthen their knowledge and understanding of the upcoming changes.



Alameda County

Train the Trainer Session for Program Coordinators of Allen Temple Arms

On April 5, five program coordinators from Allen Temple Arms, American Baptist Homes of the West (ABHOW), and other low-income senior housing facilities learned about how to direct their residents to CCI resources when notices begin to go out to Alameda in the fall.

Beneficiary Outreach

On April 9, residents of **St. Mary's Garden**, a low-income senior housing building with a large Asian-American population, attended a CCI overview presentation held in English, Mandarin, and Cantonese. Residents appreciated being able to ask questions about the enrollment timeline in their preferred language.

Other Recent Events

Ombudsman Services Now Open

As of April 1, Cal MediConnect participants can ask questions and resolve problems regarding their health care through the Cal MediConnect Ombudsman Program. Although housed within the Department of Managed Health Care (DMHC) and initiated with help from the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), the ombudsman service will be performed by independent, external firms. This will ensure that objective third parties assist enrollees and provide feedback to DHCS.

The ombudsman program is designed to:

- assist enrollees filing appeals and complaints where needed;
- investigate, negotiate and resolve enrollee problems/complains with Cal MediConnect plans; and
- refer enrollees to relevant entities and programs as needed.

The ombudsman program will offer independent, local, person-centered, and linguistically and culturally competent assistance with Cal MediConnect issues.
